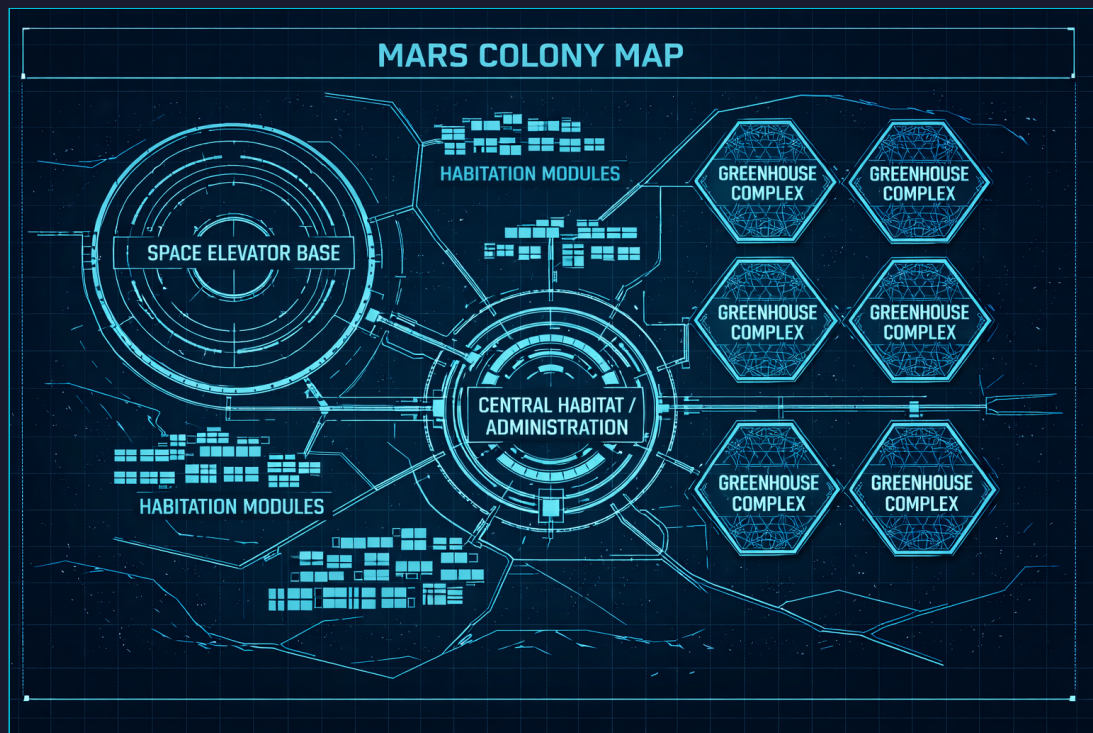

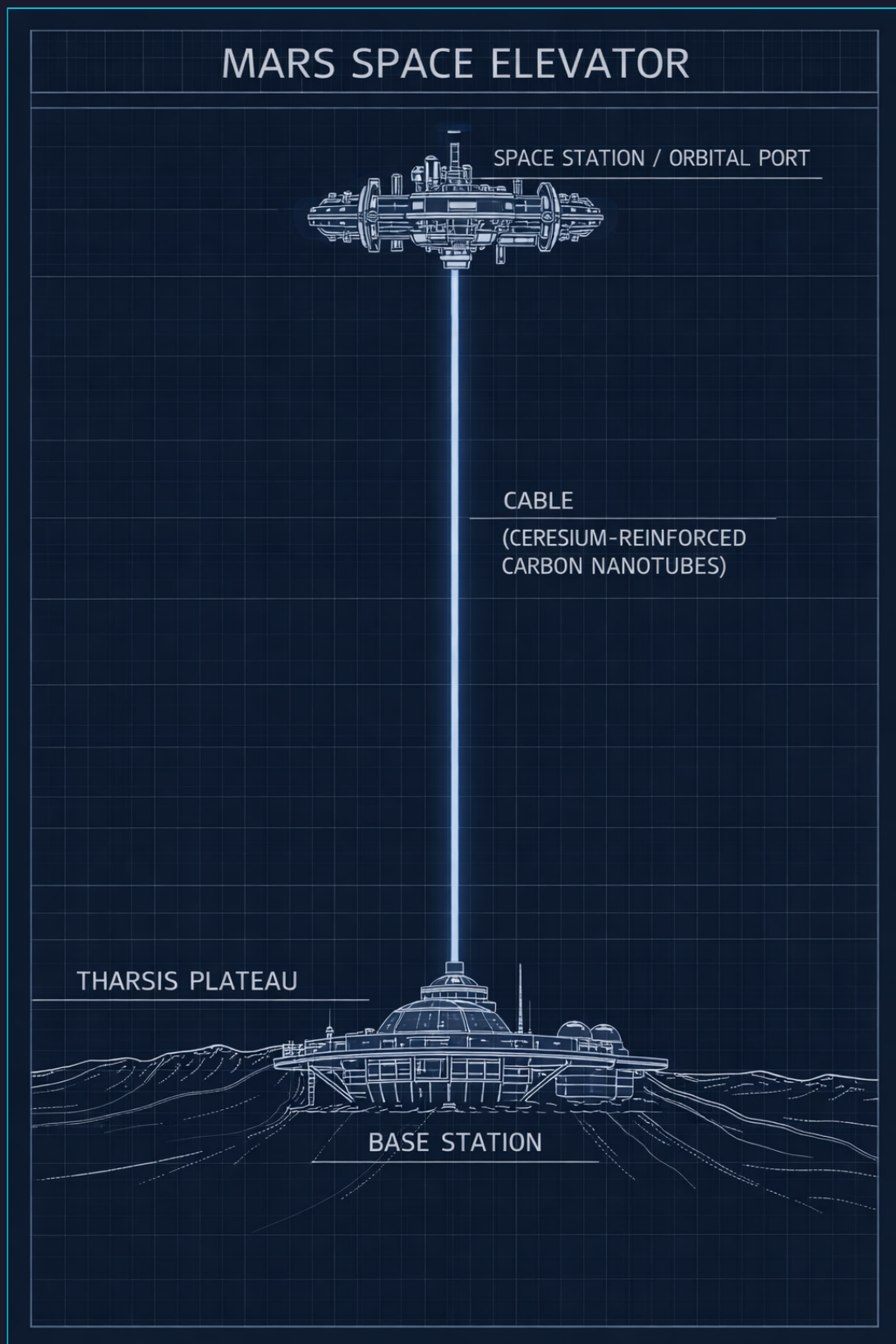
Colony Overview

Key Locations

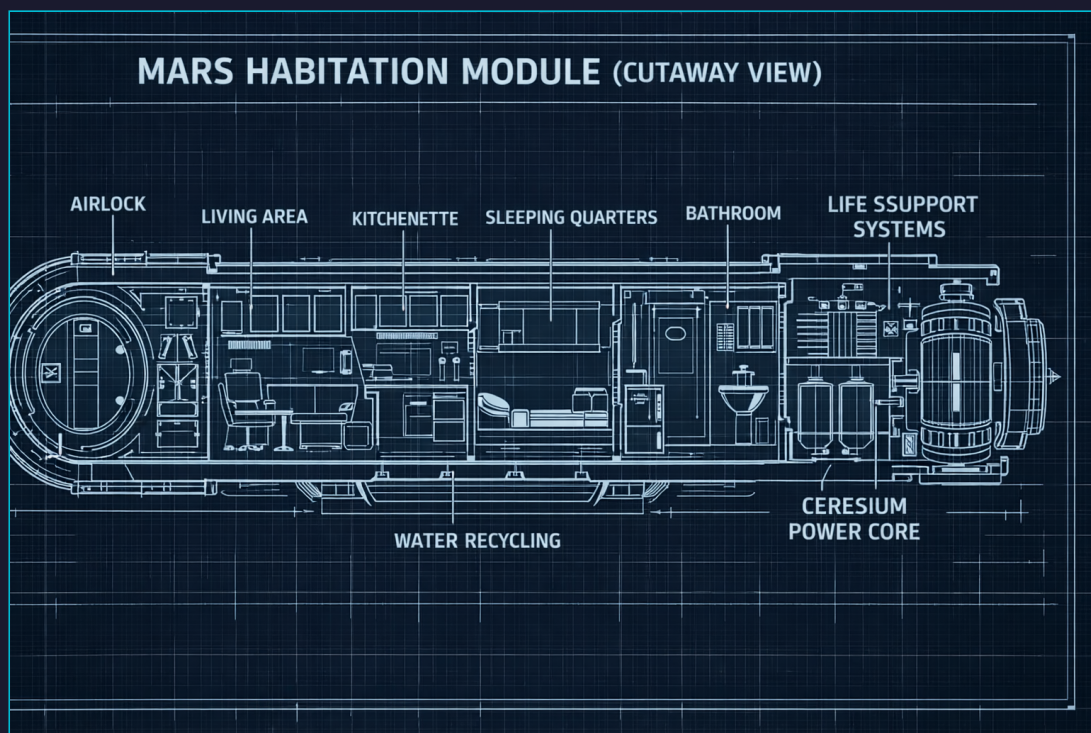

Technology Guide: Powering Our Future

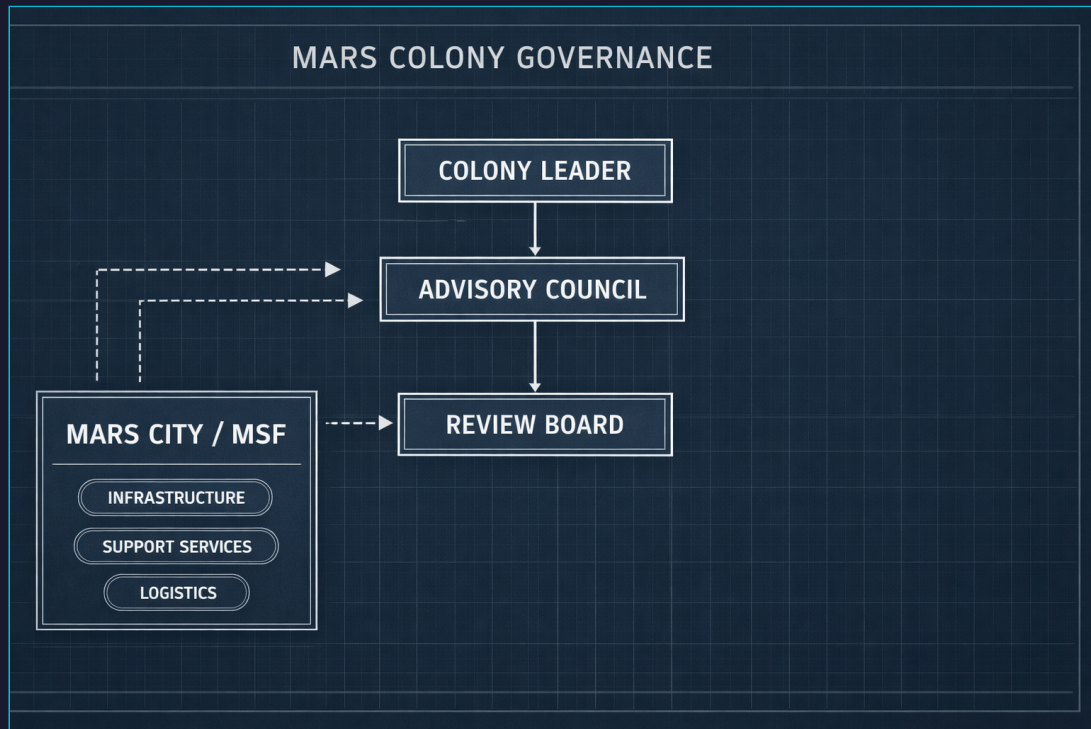
